Board of Education Room Organizational Meeting
Call Regular meeting to order at 7:01p.m.
The Regular January organizational meeting of Doniphan-Trumbull School was called to order in open and public session on Wednesday January 10, 2018 at 7:01pm in the Community Room at Doniphan-Trumbull High School by Superintendent Russell.

Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all member of the Board of Education. The availability of the agenda was communicated in the publicized notice and a current copy of the Agenda was maintained as stated in the publicized notice. All proceedings of the Board of Education, except as may be hereinafter noted, were taken while the convened meeting was in open session to the attendance of the public. Motion by Sullivan, seconded by Roach to give authorization to Superintendent Russell to administer the election of Board President for 2018. Voting yes: Sullivan, Roach, Rainforth, Sadd, VanDiest, and Vincent.

Craig Vincent was nominated for Board President.

Motion by Roach, seconded by VanDiest to close nominations and to cast a unanimous ballot for Craig Vincent as President of the Board. Voting yes: Roach, VanDiest, Rainforth, Sadd and Sullivan.

Brent Rainforth was nominated for Board Vice-President. Motion by Sullivan, seconded by Sadd to close nominations and to cast a unanimous ballot for Brent Rainforth as Vice President of the Board. Voting Yes: Sullivan, Sadd, Roach, VanDiest, and Vincent.

Randy Sadd was nominated for Board Secretary. Motion by Sullivan, seconded by Rainforth to close nominations and to cast a unanimous ballot for Randy Sadd as Board Secretary. Voting yes: Sullivan, Rainforth, Roach, VanDiest and Vincent.

Steph Roach was nominated for Board Treasurer. Motion by VanDiest, seconded by Rainforth to close nominations and to cast a

unanimous ballot for Steph Roach as Board Treasurer. Voting Yes: VanDiest, Rainforth, Vincent, Sullivan, and Sadd.

Motion by Rainforth and Seconded by Roach to designate Bank of Doniphan and Heritage Bank as the depositories for school district fund. Voting yes: Rainforth, Roach, Sadd, Sullivan Vincent and VanDiest.

Motion by Sullivan and Seconded by Roach to designate Superintendent, Superintendent Designee to use signature stamps on all approved monthly claims/payroll. Voting yes; Sullivan, Roach, Rainforth, Sadd, VanDiest, and Vincent.

Motion by VanDiest seconded by Rainforth to Designate of Authority of Superintendent and bookkeeping Agents for "Prior Approval Purchase" for District Accounting through Internet, On-line Banking and district credit cards/debit cards. Voting yes: VanDiest, Rain-

forth, Sadd, Roach, Vincent and Sullivan.

Motion by Vincent seconded by Rainforth to authorize Superintendent Russell as District Administrator, along with Signature Authorization for all Local, State and Federal Programs. Voting yes: Vincent, Rainforth, Sullivan, VanDiest, Roach, Sadd.

Motion by Sullivan, seconded by Roach to authorize Peterbilt Motor Company, Nebraska Machinery Corp, and Dinsdale as district Bus Route Mechanics. Voting yes: Sullivan, Roach, Rainforth, Sadd, VanDiest and Vincent.

Motion by Rainforth, Seconded by Sadd to authorize the use of KSB Law Firm and/or Perry Law Firm for District Services. Voting yes: Rainforth, Sadd, Roach, Sullivan, VanDiest and Vincent.

Motion by VanDiest, Seconded by Sadd to elect Steph Roach, Brent Rainforth and Craig Vincent

Board members to the 2018 Americanism Committee. Voting Yes: VanDiest, Sadd, Rainforth, Vincent, Sullivan, and Roach.
